The Russia-Ukraine War: President Vladimir Putin, Patriarch Kirill & the Russian Orthodox Church, and the World Council of Churches

A couple of media reports about the Russia-Ukraine War occurred during our winter which may have some interest for the Partnership in Print readers.

The Saturday Paper (29th June-6th July) published a Comment article by Stan Grant FASSA (theologian, writer & Sturt University distinguished professor) titled "Understanding Vladimir Putin". In March this year, the Russian Orthodox Church (ROC) leaders released a document titled "The Present and Future of the Russian World" that speaks in apocalyptic terms about "protecting the world from the onslaught of globalism and the victory of the

West fallen into Satanism". Grant writes that "it amounted to a call to arms for the faithful" and "largely overlooked and under-reported in the West, the church fathers again stressed the invasion of Ukraine was a holy war." For Grant, it is a distortion of Christ's message of love and forgiveness. The World Council of Churches (WCC) has rejected the ROC document and does not support Russia's invasion of Ukraine and the war, nor the description of a "Holy War".

Grant wrote that the ROC Patriarch Kirill considers Putin as a "gift from God" and the defender of the Russian World - "the Russkiy Mir". For Putin, "Russia is the promise of salvation against a world gone wrong, a world dominated by a godless and decadent West." Grant writes that "to men such as Patriarch Kirill, Putin is waging nothing less than a crusade. He refers to the 'kingdom and the priesthood'".

Grant refers to the view of the Ukranian political scientist Lena Surzhko Harned that the war is a joint mission of church and state "making Russia a

spiritual, cultural and political centre of civilisation to counter the liberal, secular ideology of the West". Grant mentions that ROC Priests bless nuclear weapons and preach their own version of jihad, called "podvig": a "holy war that stretches from the conflicts of the 1300s to WWII and the wars on Chechnya.

Ukraine is the latest battleground". While hundreds of priests have signed letters protesting the brutality of the war against Ukraine, in the ABC RN Religion & Ethics Report (24th July), presented by Andrew West, the Rev. Dr. Jerry Pillay, the general secretary of the World Council of Churches (WCC), spoke about the WCC relationship with the Russian Orthodox Church, which has been a WCC member since 1948, about

its support of President Putin, and the Russian Government, in attacking Ukraine and blessing it as a "Holy War". For the WCC, one of the most serious consequences of the Ukraine War has been the split in the global Orthodox Church. Pew Research estimates there are 260 million Orthodox Christians worldwide. Since 1948 there has been much opportunity for dialogue between the WCC & ROC that, *inter alia*, enables the WCC spokespersons to speak Truth to the ROC, just as they do with the other members of the WCC. The World Council of Churches-Russian Orthodox Church dialogue continues!

TO HOPE AND ACT WITH CREATION SEASON OF CREATION 2024

The firstfruits of hope (Rom 8:19-25)

In the letter of Paul the apostle to the Romans, the biblical image pictures the Earth as a Mother, groaning as in childbirth (Rom 8:22). Francis of Assisi understood this when he referred to the Earth as our sister and our mother in his Canticle of Creatures. The times we live in show that we are not relating to the Earth as a gift from our Creator, but rather as a resource to be used.

And yet, there is hope and the expectation for a better future. To hope in a biblical context does not mean to stand still and quiet, but rather groaning, crying, and actively striving for new life amidst the struggles. Just as in childbirth, we go through a period of intense pain, but new life springs forth. 1st September - 4th October each year

The **Season of Creation** is the annual Christian celebration to pray and respond together to the cry of Creation: the ecumenical family around the world unites to listen and care for our common home, the Oikos of God.

Pillay stated that the WCC does not enter the conversations as a political player - as "politicians". Rather, the WCC spokesperson speaks from justice perspectives... Christians seeking justice.... living their faith, faithfully! He referenced the history of a decade ago in the Middle East, when Christian Churches were being attacked. Christians in the Holy Land were being "squeezed out". What of the role of the WCC in those circumstances? Faith & justice mattered. Where people have the freedom to practice their faith, a government has the responsibility to protect the religious faith of their people. WCC churches and members should not have their faith diluted by political leaders. The WCC representatives seek Truth and justice in their dialogues, living their Christian faith and beliefs.

The ABC RN Religion & Ethics Report (31st July), focused on "The moral calculus of war", in which Andrew West had a conversation with Professor Nigel Biggar, an Oxford University moral philosopher and theologian, and the author of a paper titled "All Things Considered Making Moral Sense of the Wars in Ukraine and Gaza". Emily Crawford, the Sydney University Professor of International Humanitarian Law, also participated in this conversation. I commend this conversation to readers.

What of President Putin's faith and beliefs? In *The Saturday Paper* article Stan Grant references that the Russian President has written about his mother, a ROC Christian, "defying his father and secretly baptising him during the communist, atheistic, Soviet Union. In 1993, Putin's mother asked that he take his baptismal cross with him on a visit to Israel, where he had it blessed at the Tomb of the Lord. He has not taken it off since."

Grant adds that "to understand the complexity and religiosity of Putin is not to excuse him. There were geopolitical and historical factors that contributed to the invasion of Ukraine, <u>but</u> the decision to make war (that) has brought error and death to innocent people was Putin's alone. His is an act of aggression. We cannot underestimate faith and politics in Russia. We cannot think the embrace of orthodoxy is merely a populist play by Putin. If we do, we misjudge the stakes in Ukraine and how far Putin might go for victory". Grant considers Putin "a product of his nation, his faith and his history. He fashions himself as a defender of the faith, resisting the decadence of the West."

And what of the position of Patriarch Kirill and the leaders of the Russian Orthodox Church? Are they speaking TRUTH, justice and Christian values to President Putin, the Russian Government, the members of the Russian Orthodox Church and the people of Russia?

COCO REPORT

CoCo met on 3rd August at Gisborne with most members present.

We discussed the issues around streamed worship and it was reinforced that the person operating technical equipment for streaming worship on that day, needs to arrive at least half an hour before worship starts so that any connection problems can be ironed out well before 9.30am. There will be an A4 sheet of troubleshooting instructions to also help in connection between churches. Annette has words for many hymns that can be added to a Powerpoint presentation, but hymn books can also be used.

The meeting after the Partnership Service in June provided some feedback on the Act 2 recommendations, but we are waiting for further information from Synod about actions that will need to be taken by local congregations.

Our website currently shows photos of our church buildings so it would be good if congregations could take some photos of events happening in our churches. If personal photos are taken permission must be given to have these photos uploaded to the website and there is a standard form that can be used for this purpose.

There are some property issues with the Kyneton church building and there will be a consultation with relevant people from Presbytery and Synod towards the end of August to identify these issues.

Further contact is to be made with Cobaw Community Health regarding potential use of the Woodend Manse, the alternative being to commence a commercial lease.

Annette's report included the many connections she is making around the Partnership communities, as well as her leading of worship. She also gave recognition to the leadership of many people around the Partnership in local activities.

Tylden have been hosting Delightful Diners dinners at various venues around the Partnership, so ask your CoCo rep for details if you're interested in having a fun night out.

There are various events throughout the month at each congregation, so check the calendar and join in with others from the Partnership.
