Wendy's Report

Snippets from Wendy's report to CoCo. It has been a wonderful month of changing weather and settling in and getting to know people and the surrounding area. I attended the community walk in support of suicide prevention and then went on to Lancefield to share in the service with them. I have been to Mia Mia and Sutton Grange to conduct worship, and to Romsey to bless the animals. Sunday afternoons have seen our open afternoon (which was a lovely time of relaxing together) a vegetarian lunch (with MRVEG and the sustainability group) and visiting in Melbourne hospitals. I also met with Bronwyn and Robert around some new possibilities and initiatives for transforming encounters within our communities. I have enjoyed visiting in the aged care facilities. I also conducted a funeral at Romsey this week. I have met with many of our wonderful congregation members in a variety of locations. I also met with Barb Davis at Gisborne Secondary College and with the chaplain from Victoria Police who is looking to have a police chaplain in the area. Lunch with Tylden UCAF was a highlight and I have attended the Thistle Club and the Mt Macedon Elders meeting. I popped in to Riddells Creek Craft group and the Mt Macedon Men's Group. The hospitality has been outstanding. I also met up with the Kyneton Ministers group.

This week saw the first of Woodend's fortnightly worship services over a Monday evening meal. This is held at the Manse and it was really enjoyable and quite special to be creating flexible worship around the table. I am on the last big essay for my Masters degree (on Church and Community) and I am working hard to complete this. I have my valedictory soon although graduation isn't until next March. I had a session of supervision this week and am feeling well supported. My thanks for all your efforts towards serving our Macedon Ranges community in partnership together.

Wendy finds that people contacting her as needs arise is working well. Robert Renton encouraged congregations to take the initiative to engage with ministers, and alert them to needs in their communities. As the Macedon Ranges Partnership is so large this will be the only way that the project will work, and ministers will be able to work where they are required to meet the needs of all congregations.

Judy undertakes pastoral care and attends meetings on Thursday and Friday. Judy has made a lot of home visits. She is now also taking services on Sunday.

2nd Minister

The Joint Nominating Committee has also found our second minister, who will begin with us on 1st February. Rev Peter Cannon comes from Sunbury and will take on the role of Resource Minister. They are searching very hard for the last minister who will fill our team of Ministers for the Partnership in the role of Regeneration Pastoral Care Minister.

Total Fire Ban Days

CoCo has made the decision that <u>any</u> church meetings or activities being held on days of Total Fire Ban in the Extreme or Code Red days will be cancelled within the Macedon Ranges Partnership. This will apply to both the Central and North Central fire districts.

Kyneton Manse

The Kyneton Manse sewerage works have been completed. They can now apply for the title. Quotes are being gained to erect a paling fence around the manse in line with the heritage overlay. Discussion was held about what happens to the proceeds from the sale of property.

The proposed plan would only require 4 preachers on a Sunday morning. 4 preachers will each do 2 services. Some preachers have indicated that they prefer to only do 1 service of a morning, which can be accommodated. If the new suggestion was implemented congregations would see a minister more often around the partnership.

A meeting of the people who are currently organizing the preaching timetables will be held on Monday 26th October at 7pm at the Woodend Manse. The preaching plan for December - February will be organised. The attendees can then return to their congregations and discuss the outcome with their church councils.



The Earliest Saints

³He went up the mountain and called to him those whom he wanted, and they came to him. ¹⁴And he appointed twelve, whom he also named apostles, to be with him, and to be sent out to proclaim the message, ¹⁵and to have authority to cast out demons. ¹⁶So he appointed the twelve: Simon (to whom he gave the name Peter); 17James son of Zebedee and John the brother of James (to whom he gave the name Boanerges, that is. Sons of Thunder); ¹⁸and Andrew, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus, and Simon the Cananaean, ¹⁹and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him. (Mark 3:13-19 NRSV)



The Twelve Apostles

Pictured as twelve sheep or twelve shepherds. Shown with an X symboliz-

ing that they went out into all the world - north, south, east and west.



Saint Peter

The crossed keys are usually assigned to Saint Peter because of the word of the Lord to him in Matthew 16:19.

Other symbols for Saint Peter are the inverted cross; the crowing cock; and the church on a rock.



Saint James, the greater

Saint James is said to have travelled a great deal in order to preach the Gospel to many people.

The escallop shell is a symbol for the traveller because he used this shell to scoop water to drink on his travels.

Other emblems for Saint James are: the sword and the shell: the staff and the wallet: the staff and the hat: the staff and the sword crossed.



Saint John, the Apostle

This symbol is assigned to Saint John because an attempt was made on his life through poison put into the com-

munion cup. Showing the serpent arising out of the chalice was the only way in which they could make you think of poison in the wine.

Other emblems for Saint John are: an eagle over a cauldron; the scroll of the Gospel or Revelation; a serpent and a sword.

Saint Andrew

Saint Andrew is said to have died on a cross shaped like an "X". Since the date of the first Sunday in Advent is always

the Sunday nearest to Saint Andrew's day (November 30), the cross has become the emblem of the beginning and the end of the Church Year. Other symbols for Saint Andrew are: the crossed fishes: the cross and the fish-net with a boathook.

Saint Philip -L

The cross and the two loaves are as-00 signed to Saint Philip because of his answer to the Lord in John 6:7.

Other symbols for Saint Philip are: a basket filled with bread; a spear and patriarchal cross; a cross and a carpenter's square.

Saint Bartholomew

Saint Bartholomew died by being skinned alive. He was tortured to death for the Gospel. His symbol shows his faithfulness to the word of God, while the knife reminds us of his terrible tortures.

Other emblems for Saint Bartholomew are: three knives; or the branch of a fig tree.

Saint Matthew (Levi), the Apostle

00 Because Saint Matthew was a tax collector when Jesus called him, he has the three money bags assigned as his symbol.

Other symbols for Saint Matthew are: the money chest and the battle axe.



Saint Thomas

Saint Thomas was evidently a twin because in John 11:16 he is called "Didymus." Saint Thomas was possibly the

first missionary in India. There, it is said, he built a Church with his own hands. This is symbolized by a carpenter's square. He was finally slain by the spear of a heathen priest; therefore, the spear is used in his emblem also.

Other emblems for Saint Thomas are: a spear, four arrows and a square; a spear, four arrows and three stones; three stones and a leather girdle.



Saint Jude

Saint Jude (not to be confused with Judas Iscariot whose shield is always blank) also bears the name Thaddeus or Lebbaeus. The ship is a sign of mission voyages made for Christ.

Other emblems for Saint Jude include: the inverted cross; a spear and a club; loaves and a fish.



1 Saint James, the minor

The saw is the symbol of Saint James Minor. Hegesippus says that Saint James was thrown from the pinnacle

of the temple and then his body was sawed in pieces.

Other emblems are: three stones; a windmill.

1 Saint Simon



Saint Simon is also known as the "Zealot" because he evidently belonged to

this group within Israel at the time of Christ. He is usually shown with a fish on a book to emphasize that he was a fisher of men through the Gospel.

Other symbols include: two oars and a battle axe; a fuller's club; a long saw and an oar crossed.

Saint Paul

Saint Paul has the sword assigned to him because he was a persecutor of the Church. The book is a symbol of his conversion into the greatest preacher of the Church. The great change in Saint Paul shows itself in this that he afterward speaks of the Word of God and the Sword of the Spirit (Ephesians 6:17).
