Is this article about change? Yes and no, not really, and in fact perhaps the opposite!!

as indeed have many of our current church folk. The future generations should be well set to enjoy the benefits of the legacy we leave them. Our attitude to these needs to be about holding the church lightly, about how we can prepare for the future and encourage the next generation to embrace whatever church will look like for them. The church is not owned by us. We are the expression of the church, of God's missional love for the world, its embodiment in this place and time This is a priority above our own comfort and enjoyment of the things of the past. Yet this is important too.

We need to be steadfast in our love and custodianship of the Body of Christ, yet to hold it lightly and gently and allow our paths to be directed by the one who holds it all together in love. We listen deeply to the Spirit and discern the way we would go into ever deeper mission. How wonderful it is to know we are held and that as Church we are loved into new life every day.

In 1989, when a local teenager, Jenny Marie McGrath, suggested a drama group be formed to give the young people in the community an interesting activity, no-one could have imagined that it would morph into 'The Revellers' and still be running 30 years later. Arnold Jenkins and Lyn Brown were the enthusiastic founders of the group.

The original young people in 'The Revellers' have now grown up and most have children of their own (do they ever think back to the good old days?) but 'The Revellers' has continued and grown over those years.

The group has always been a volunteer team who give their time each year to present five concerts in May and June.

TRAGIC NEGLECT

Tragedies come upon humans due to various causes. We see death, injury and destruction in Syria because of deliberate violence. And there are tragedies which are accidental like car accidents. But there is a third category: tragedies which result from neglect. One of these took place in Wales 52 years ago when a mine tip collapsed on a school and some houses in the town of Aberfan: 134 children, teachers and other adults were killed. The neglect was the responsibility of the National Coal Board which ignored warnings that the mine tip was unstable.

The Welsh composer Karl Jenkins decided to recognise the 50th anniversary with a piece of music called Cantata Memoria: for the children. The Gisborne Singers will perform this work, with a choir of children, in May. We believe it will be the Australian premiere. When the choir performed Jenkins' The Armed Man: a Mass for Peace two years ago, people were moved to tears. The Cantata Memoria is also a moving work, but with a message of hope.

Coco Report

for Meeting held Saturday 7th April 2018 at Romsey UC

<u>Welcome</u>: Chairperson Colin Chapman welcomed us and thanked Romsey for allowing us to have the Meeting there, as Lancefield, who were scheduled to be the venue, are having some renovations done.

<u>Devotions</u>: Ian Kennedy played a CD of meditative music from the Daintree, this allowed some contemplative time before our discussions. Colin finished off this time with a prayer.

The Minutes of the previous meeting: were amended slightly and then passed by consensus.

Congregation AGM's: It was thought that it would be good to have one of the Ministers attend each Congregation's AGM. Please consider this when setting AGM dates, this means questions or issues can be sorted as they arise. Query re Worship Services at Woodend and Riddell's Creek. Encourage people to attend the Inter-generational Service at Riddell and/or Prayers for Peace at Woodend. Both of these Services offer a meaningful opportunity for worship. See details in PIP for both of these Services. Wendy wrote the **Ministry Team Report** for this meeting. The report contains aspects of Lent and Easter Services throughout the Ranges and the wide scope of Community Participation our Ministers are involved in. Also use of Woodend UC buildings. This Report is published in this edition of PIP (see opposite page) and also available to read in the various Partnership Churches.

<u>Property:</u> Ian Kennedy reported that the Building Engineer has not yet put in a formal report on the work needed to upgrade the Woodend UC buildings. Until this is received the Electrician and Plumber who have also been consulted are not able to quote for their part of rectification work. Much discussion ensued on the way forward for the Woodend property. Neil Tweddle

has agreed to Chair a working group to sort out the way forward with involvement from Woodend locals, Colin Chapman etc.

Still unsure of how the lease on the current Woodend Op. Shop will work out when it expires. Whether possible to remain in existing position or relocate to the Church. More information as it becomes available.

Update of facilities at Riddells Creek UC are about to begin. New kitchen, storage area etc. – David Liebich will manage this work.

<u>Camp:</u> Peter Cannon has reported that the Church Camp at Malmsbury is set to go ahead in July – see info in PIP.

<u>Pastoral:</u> Annette reported a lot of Pastoral Care issues in the Partnership at the moment. Hope to get "Next of Kin" list up and running soon. Also would like feedback on material used during Lent.

Resources for taking Services always available.

Reports from the Congregations: mainly positive – Groups active, renovations happening, events planned, Easter Services well attended. Some concerns re health issues of congregation members and their families.

<u>Uniting Age Well:</u> Discussion on request by Uniting Age Well to do a presentation at Partnership Churches. Also office space to be made available on a regular basis. They are able to guide people through the method of gaining access to various support systems to help people remain in their own homes or residential care if needed. (Registration with the Commonwealth Govt. "My Age Care"). Then arrange to provide these services, mainly using local people. Probably a positive for most of "a certain age" even if not needed at the present time. We will liaise with Kerry from Age Well.

Banners: Teardrop banners for display at Partnership and individual Church events are being ordered.

Closing: We closed with the Benediction.

Thanks to Lancefield for bringing a delicious Morning Tea.

Next Meeting will be on June 2nd at Sutton Grange UC.

Ministry Team Report to CoCo Meeting April 2018

He is Risen!

What a special time Lent has been around the Ranges. We have had much time together reflecting on what it is to dwell in the presence of God. Annette's daily reflections have invited us to go deeper and to listen better. We have had some wonderful services and Mt Macedon hosted us in deep reflection during Holy Week. Some of us attended the Walk for Justice in support of refugees....(our Moderator spoke so well at this event). We had Tenebrae services as well as the Service of Shadows and we have shared together, walking with other churches in Stations of the Cross and communion and Hot Cross buns in the park. We have sat with courage in the pain and anguish and despair. And then Hallelujah!....we have known the newness of life and the joy of Resurrection. We have experienced the release and the letting go of the old and the rising into the gift that is new life.

As a ministry team we have lived deeply into these moments and walked alongside you all through this Season. We have held you in your pastoral needs and supported you to support each other. We have also supported the outreach of the congregations in every way we can, attending as many of these as we are able. Of course, we could spend all of our time attending these but that is only part of our call and so we entrust these missions to you and support you at the highest level we can. We are however, deeply encouraged by the range of these and the love and commitment of our people.

The usual community participation has continued. We spend our time liaising with various com-

munity groups such as Neighbourhood Houses and walking groups and ecumenical groups. We are a presence and support at the Op Shops and Days for Girls. We speak at events such as U3A and Anzac Day and so on. We visit the aged care facilities and run services in some of them. We are heartened by the support and passion of so many mission hearted people. We continue to run meditation groups and bible studies and film nights. The White Goose is an amazing space which runs through the love and outreach of those who host and support it. Our wholehearted value and support for all you are doing in the community runs deep. This is our passion and our calling. And of course we continue to hold you all in prayer and to assist and lead you in worship and wellbeing.

One of the highlights was when some of us attended the Inclusion Day run by Cobaw. It was specifically geared toward our LGBTI community and supported by the Equality Road show. We were included on the panel as they were very keen to support the spiritual needs of this group. It really was a significant day and a great honour to experience inclusion ourselves by this very vulnerable group. We will do all we can to continue to support their spiritual needs.

Another highlight is having our student, Fi working with us. She is the most amazing asset and we are enjoying learning from each other! We also continue to assist at Presbytery level on various committees and in mentoring.

WOODEND

Our meetings have been mobile around the Ranges on Wednesdays but the last few have

been at Woodend and have commenced in concerted prayer regarding our presence and mission there. First let me say thanks to those who are supporting the work there. Rehabilitating the building is such a big task but the work there is guite astounding to me. We have a very small group meeting for prayer and lunch on Mondays. While the numbers are low it is such a privileged and sacred space and the depth of our worship has been truly a blessing. We have people attend from the community and from various other churches and I believe it has been a true blessing to all of us. We recently hosted a Close the Gap morning tea in solidarity with our indigenous folk and in a stand with them against the injustice and inequality they experience. We were disappointed in the numbers but were encouraged by the passion and conversations with some attendees from other churches and from the community.

The interior of the Woodend church has been cleared and opened up and is in use as a Worship and Wellbeing centre for various sessions such as yoga and other wellness groups. It is a

beautiful space and those who attend are finding it touches them spiritually.

The office space is used by a number of individuals and groups for meetings and administrative space. We are still in conversation about use of the hall with our Muslim brothers and sisters.

Our vision for Woodend is still being developed and we are hoping that as we refurbish it we can allow fuller involvement by the community and can be a place for connection and relationship to develop. We have some exciting ideas and believe that as we dovetail our forms of mission here that they will enhance one another and help us be a presence here. Programs such as a Foodbank will help us with this and then may be able to be developed in several of our locations. Our listening and discerning together in prayer has tuned us in further to the needs and to the possibilities. Stay tuned for the next exciting episode.

We continue to hold our people and their pastoral and missional needs in prayer and we walk with you into a future filled with possibility and Resurrection potential. He is Risen!!!
